Thank you for your support this year! I want to give you an update on how I finished my freshman year at Howard.

This spring semester I took 19 credits and ended my freshman year with a 4.0 GPA. While working toward my major, I was able to put my learning to the test outside the classroom. My peers and I competed in the MorganHacks Hackathon at Morgan State University in April. We won a \$1,000 award for our application idea that uses Al to help food pantries run more smoothly. I hope to serve on the planning committee for Howard's hackathon projected for next year.

I also started classes for my TV and Film minor. Through my participation in the Howard University Film Organization, I was able to further realize my interest in film. I filmed an episode for our Afro-surrealism anthology film series, "Where's Everybody At?". It was amazing to be on such a professional set with other young, black creatives. Honestly, my semester was full of creative ventures. I competed in the HBCU Speech and Debate National Championship and was a finalist for a poetry performance. My voice-acting experience was furthered by doing a voice-over for a Howard MFA short film. I also filmed more TV and radio spots as the new voice of Corewell Health, one of Michigan's largest healthcare systems.

Alongside some long nights studying and new memories with my friends, this is just a fraction of what I was able to do in my first year in college. This summer, I will be working as an intern for Exploring Your Authentic Self through Arts (EASA), a nonprofit program for Chicago high school students to find their voice through the arts and public speaking. For the rest of the summer, I will be traveling to D.C., South Africa, and Ireland as a Frederick Douglass Global Fellow as the only fellow from an HBCU.
